



Skill sets in Digital Humanities are increasingly becoming indispensable for all subdisciplines of Classical Studies. As a final step in the Basel Papyrus Project, the Institute of Ancient History is offering a training session to learn how to encode (in TEI EpiDoc XML) **Ancient Greek and Coptic texts on papyrus** from the Basel University collection in a major web-based resource: papyri.info. Papyri.info presents transcriptions, metadata, links to related resources, images and translations of papyri in collections around the world and allows statistical analysis, search and retrieval or data visualization.

This event will take place on **June 19 – 21, 2019** (R 306 (Petersgraben 51) and will be led by one of the main architects and designers of papyri.info, **Dr. James Cowey** from Heidelberg University.

This event is open to any student and member of the University with knowledge of Ancient Greek and/or Coptic. Depending on the number of participants, a specific session can be devoted to Coptic.

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
